Fear Not.

How many times do you read this in the Bible?

In the King James Version of the bible, the phrase "fear not" appears over 80 times throughout the text. This phrase can appear two ways, as "fear not" or as "do not fear".

Scholars believe that this phrase emphasises the importance of trusting God.

The bible expands upon the phrase with different expressions such as "fear not for I am with you" and "be strong, fear not".

Not to contradict the above statement, the Bible also says, "Thou shalt fear the LORD thy God, and serve him, and shalt swear by his name." [Deuteronomy 6:13 KJV] Jesus later updates His followers about swearing oaths in Mathew

5:34-37. And again, "The fear of the Lord is the beginning of wisdom: and the knowledge of the holy is understanding [Proverbs 9:10 KJV].

The Bible states that the only 'fear' we should have is toward Almighty God due to who He is and His wonderous works, "I will praise thee; for I am fearfully and wonderfully made: marvellous are thy works; and that my soul knoweth right well." [Psalm 139:14 KJV]

So why are we told to fear God and yet also 'do not fear?'

This can be possibly answered by looking at what the Bible states we should fear and shouldn't fear. To me it seems God is to be feared but worldly things that cause fear should be looked at through a 'lens of faith'

The following words are taken from an interview given by John Piper, the founder of the 'Desiring God' website:

Fear in the Old Testament

Proverbs 28:14 says, "Blessed is the one who fears the Lord always, but whoever hardens his heart will fall into calamity." So fearing God is contrasted with a hard, unperceptive heart.

Or Isaiah 66:2 says, "This is the one to whom I will look: he who is humble and contrite in spirit and trembles at my word." So again, fearing is corresponding with

humility and lowliness and sensitivity of heart. The sheer majesty of God, as well as the holiness, and justice, and power, and wrath of God, cannot be approached in a cavalier spirit. It would be insane to think we can just stroll up to the Creator of the universe and have a cavalier spirit. We are blind if we think we can do that without trembling.

Fear in the New Testament

Now, is that just for the Old Testament? What does the New Testament say? Philippians 2:12–13: "Work out your own salvation with fear and trembling, for it is God who works in you." This is really interesting. You should fear and tremble because God is working to keep you. And I think it means the sheer awesome presence of God in our lives working for us, not against us, should produce trembling. That is amazing. So, the New Testament treats the fear of God as a motive for not turning away from him. We should fear in the sense that

we seek refuge from God away from God's terrible wrath. God's grace in Christ is the refuge from God's wrath outside Christ. There is terror outside of Christ, and there is a different kind of trembling inside of Christ.

Causes of fear and worries in our daily lives.

The world likes to 'deceive' folk into fear. If you are inclined to believe many of the news articles that appear via mainstream news outlets, you are more than likely in a varying state of fear most days. Fear to the ungodly is a weapon of control to take a believers focus and trust from God. [If used too aggressively it can backfire when people feel their only 'escape' is turning to God.]

Stories and reports of climate crisis, war, disease, food shortages, financial collapse.

Oh, the end is nigh!

The call of Christians is not to fear the End Times, or to flee from them, but to engage them in the power of the Spirit. God is in control, and God's redemption is secured. Of that, we can be confident, and thus, we need not fear.

Jesus stated that we should "take heed that no one deceives you." [Matthew 24:4] If one does fall for a deception, we can then be vulnerable for manipulation. This I think is the goal of 'the great deception' mentioned by Matthew 24:24-25

So despite what is happening around you and across God's creation we need to keep strong in the faith.

As in Marks account [5:36] of Jesus speaking to Jarius, "Do not fear; only believe", keep the faith, keep your eyes on Jesus.

Finally, to sign off for now, a verse from Isaiah:

"Fear thou not; for I am with thee: be not dismayed; for I am thy God: I will strengthen thee; yea, I will help thee; yea, I will uphold thee with the right hand of my righteousness." [Isaiah 41:10]
