Pastoral Letter

Do not base your judgements upon outward appearances, but upon the truth.'

John 7 v. 24

Some years ago a national newspaper ran an advertising campaign based on the slogan. 'One million readers can't be wrong'. The implication being that if enough people subscribe to something it must be right! It's human nature to want to follow the crowd. Those who question the established norms of society are branded as heretic, eccentric or even revolutionaries, - their challenge conveniently side-stepped through the use of such dismissive labels. Sometimes, such questions may be out of place, but equally there are times when they need asking,- faith having to take a critical look at the values the world takes for granted if it's to be true to itself.

The story of Samuel in the Old Testament is an illustration of such a question. Sent by God to the house of Jesse to anoint a new ruler over Israel, he was confident in his own ability to judge the character needed to fulfil such a role. But he came away recognising that he had much to learn about the ways of God, who sees far deeper than any of us can begin to see. Seven of Jesse's sons passed before Samuel, but although he thought any one of them might have been the chosen one none of them matched God's criteria. It was the youngest, David, whom God had decided would be the one, - not Samuel's first choice, - or even the second or third. God sees things differently, - and He sees people differently.

Samuel's experience counsels us to be very wary of judging by appearances, and never to imagine that we have understood all there is to understand.

May you be blessed with peace and tranquility during these Summer months.
