Pastoral Letter

'Bear one another's burdens and so fulfil the law of Christ' Galatians 6:2

I'm reminded of the time when I was due to start back at teacher training college after a long Summer break, and, of course, I had a suitcase full of 'stuff' to take back with me. To say it was heavy was an understatement; it was like a lead weight, - crammed to overflowing as I set off to the railway station to catch the train back to Eastbourne. Unsurprisingly the handle couldn't cope and a hundred years up the road it came off in my hand, the suitcase crashing down and spilling its contents all over the pavement. How glad I was, having stuffed everything back in again and wrestled with the load for the rest of the journey, to be offered a helping hand by a fellow student as I lugged it up to my room. Such a weight was really too much for one person, and I learned not to try it again!

There are few people who don't carry a burden of some sort. It might not be a physical load but it is no less difficult to bear. The weight of guilt, fear, sorrow, despair, anxiety and pain, to name but a few examples can be equally crushing, and far more so. We can't shoulder such burdens for others, even though we might wish we could, but we can share them, sometimes simply by being alongside them, and listening, - just showing we care. To be there to share the load in such a way means more than we might imagine.

How good it felt to be back worshipping face-to-face on Pentecost Sunday! It has been 19 weeks since we at Marton were able to worship in our building, and it has been longer than that for some. I wonder how many of us have been able to keep in touch with those we care about and help to bear their burdens. It hasn't been an easy year and a half, and perhaps some people have 'fallen through the cracks' of a support network. Hopefully, now that things are becoming more on an even keel, and moving to more of the normality we remember, we can pick up the threads of our caring and supporting networks.
