### Pastoral Letter

The woman left her water jar and returned to the city. She said to the people there, 'Come and see a man who told me everything I had ever done. He cannot be the Messiah can he?'

John 4 28-29

We will all at some time or other have been in a situation when a friend or acquaintance says to us, 'Let me introduce you to so-and-so.' This can, of course be nothing more than a formality, an expected social nicety, but it can mean a great deal more. A simple introduction can lead to a fascinating encounter and even a lasting friendship as two people move from being complete strangers towards getting to know each other.

If we consider that in relation to the words of the Samaritan woman in John's gospel, we might see a parallel. It may not have been an introduction in the strict sense of the word but it had much the same effect, persuading those to whom she was speaking to meet Jesus for themselves, - to talk with Him and enter into a personal encounter. And the result? 'Many Samaritans from that city believed in Him because of the woman's testimony.' (John 3 v. 39)

There is an important lesson here when it comes to Christian testimony. We might sometimes try to argue people into faith, imagining that we need to answer all their questions before they can come to believe. What is actually required, however is something far simpler, - merely to introduce people to Jesus, - to ensure that they know of Him and about Him. we can do our part....the rest is up to Him!
