TRINITY SUNDAY

Trinity Sunday Heralds that part of the year known as 'Ordinary Time'- a long stretch of Sundays before the arrival of Advent when we look forward to Christmas. The name 'ordinary' seems to fit that point in the Christian year where there are no special celebrations - but it is anything but - 'ordinary.'

In the first part of the year, we have looked at who our Lord Jesus was and his meaning to us in faith. Now we can explore the meaning of the Christian life for ourselves in the context of the largely secular society of 2023 - in which we now live. This can appear to be a formidable prospect or an exciting opportunity if we allow our faith in Jesus to make us optimists.

In our Trinity Sunday service Dr Donna Moore likened the Trinity: Father, Son and Holy Spirit to the famous story of the Three Musketeers by the 19th century French author Alexandre Dumas. Here we have the three main characters: Arthos, Portus and D'Artagnan and their memorable motto: *'All for one and one for all.'* How well that famous motto describes the Trinity: three in one, or one in three - so we have a father looking over us, a son, in Jesus, being amongst us and we, inheriting the spirit of that God that came from both of them. A perfect unity in the search to bring heaven here on earth.

Dr Moore used the passage from the prophet Isaiah chapter 40 to illustrate in simple terms what this means for us. The prophet's intention is to take away our focus from everything else so we can consider the Sovereign Lord, the one true living God. So important as pard of the Christian life. The chapter begins with a message of comfort and redemption from the Lord and then it points to the coming of Christ and the good news - the Gospel. Let us today take comfort from Isaiah's message and with that comfort have confidence to go forward, boldly - going where the Holy Spirit of God takes us as we endeavour to live the Christian life with the joyful rewards it will bring.

CHURCH WALL REPAIR

In June it was arranged for the south gable wall in the church to be redecorated to remedy and cover water damage caused dampness attributed to a fallen length of guttering, which allowed rainwater to run down the outer wall. unfortunately, the decorator discovered that the plasterwork was in too poor a condition for painting. The work was suspended, and a builder brought in to assess the damage and make quotations for further repairs. Replastering, within the building, and repointing of brickwork and waterproofing of the outside wall will mean that there will be some delay before the work is completed.
