HIGHLIGHTS OF THE CHURCH MEETING Sunday, 2nd, July.

The main item was an open discussion on the issue of worship, which is crucial as a central point of our activities as a church fellowship.

In the opening part of the discussion ideas to improve the general way in which we conduct our services were considered. These included the use of a projector, which by encouraging people to look ahead, would help to improve the hymn singing. The use of inclusive language in prayers and the fitting of a loop system or microphone, so that everything can be clearly heard in the sanctuary, helping create and improve the spiritual atmosphere during worship.

The replacement of pews with chairs has given us the opportunity to promote more active participation and better use of a versatile seating. This can then lead onto developing different styles of worship and including more modern hymns. However, the most important aspect of all of these ideas is that everyone should, at some point in a service, be encouraged to make an active contribution to the worship. This is the way to strengthen our faith as we exchange ideas on how our Lord Jesus would wish us to live the Christian life.

On The 15th of October at Marton United Reformed Church, there will be a *Joint Pastorate Communion Service* led by the new moderator of the Northern Province of the United Reformed Church, the *Rev Kim Plumpton*. All seven churches are asked take one minute to explain *'What gift they bring to the communion table.'* Our gift could be the idea of being inclusive, as we are registered for same-sex marriage and have a worship space which is very adaptable and, being a small place, creates a naturally friendly atmosphere.
