A meeting of members was held on Sunday, the 2nd, July after the morning worship.

News was shared about other members not able to attend. Don Beattie has spent some time in hospital following a fall and Mary Sollett has also been in hospital following a stroke and heart attack and is now recovering at home. Our best wishes go to those members for their full recovery.

Thanks for express to Susan Griffiths for the Strawberry Tea and Coffee Morning held on Saturday, 1st, July. There was general agreement that the church presented itself as an attractive venue, which could be adapted to other community uses.

Worship Outreach and Evangelism Ideas were raised by Ray Tunnicliffe and discussed. Several points of importance were raised including holding another fellowship service (where all members are involved actively in the worship) and holding an anniversary celebration to mark the fact that the church will be 225 years old this year. It was agreed that the anniversary event and the fellowship service will be held on the weekend of the 28th 29th of October. It was also agreed that we would discuss worship at the next meeting - it being the most important and central part of our activities as a church.

Under the heading of 'property' it was noted that the south Gable wall needed some repair before it could be painted. The total cost of this was such that some financial report may be required from Synod. A Fire Safety Assessment has been done throughout the church and also the Church flat. The garden has also been cleared and tidied up.

In the financial report the treasurer thanked members for their generous contributions to Gift Day.

Dave Herbert, our Synod Moderator retired in July and so members were invited to a farewell thanksgiving service held in Newcastle. The new moderator Rev Mim Plumpton will take up office in September.

Updates from the Group Elders. Ken Harris, a former Guisborough Church member and his wife Margaret, have joined Marton URC and Redcar Church, now Hosting the Baptist fellowship, hope to hold services, in the URC tradition, midweek.

The profile of the pastorate is available from Synod offices around the UK, but no further interest has been shown since the two earlier enquiries came to nothing. We have now been without a minister for over seven years.

REV CHARLES PRICE

The Reverend Charles Price, former minister of Redcar United Reformed Church, died on the 15th of May 2023 aged 86. He also served as minister at Chorlton, Wigtown Moor, Industrial Chaolaincy: South Norwood and Finchfiekd.

He retired to reside in Lingdale and preached in Guisborough United Reformed Church on several occasion in the years 2005/6. His last service with us was on Remembrance Day when he asked the children present: Who is your enemy? And then went onto emphasise the importance of following Christ's instruction to love your enemy. So easy to start a war so difficult to end it was the stark message from Charles Price - now gone to higher service.

IOPT Moving Stories - Committed to supporting global partners ISRAEL & OCCUPIED PALESTINE

Delicious Palestinian Food Workshops Sindyanna of Galilee is and nonprofit centre run by duration Arab women. There is Centre is a place where duration Aaron women work in equality and mutual respect.

One of the activities taking place is 'Cooking without Borders Workshops. The most recent class, which brought a unique twist, what is led by an Arab chef, Mysar Abu Shadade. With the goal of promoting Palestinian food culture, she put an emphasis on traditional dishes from her mothers kitchen in Jaffe.

Mysar sees herself as a bridge between cultures, working to 3 people from the social stigma as they may have towards Muslim Arab women from Japan. Through this, she has authored a book Cooking and Storiesin Arabic and Hebrew. As she says Arabic is my mother tongue which I can't give up, well Hebrew is the language I live in, and which allows me to reach a wider audience and convey a message of peace and love.

The United Reformed church education trip to Israel and the occupied Palestinian territory visited Sindyanna visitor centre in October 2019 and Commitment for Life ordered a limited supply of soap from there in 2022.

In July 2023 our Programme Officer, Ke in Snyman travel to Zimbabwe. He concentrated his visit in the north-east and south-east of the country, visiting our Christian Aid Partners to hear the good news stories from locals who are benefited so enormously from our partnership. "I am grateful to the Christian Aid country team that facilitate our visit," sayers Kevin. "hospitality was always so generously offered, and I saw many examples of how effective our work in the region has been."
