Organ Repairs

The swell organ has not been working for some time so the opportunity was taken in early August to dismantle and repair this part of the organ whilst the premises were relatively quiet. Initial investigation confirmed the swell organ was out of tune but more importantly the sliders that control the swell organ were sticking. These four foot long perforated timbers move under the pipes and switch the ranks of pipe on and off as required.

To gain access to the sliders, the 300 pipes of the swell organ were remover and carefully stored. It was then possible to free the sliders which were catching on a longstanding crack in the sound board. This was achieved by the careful use of sandpaper and the addition of a strip of paper to reestablish a working clearance and moving sliders.

Following this repair, the pipes were returned to the swell box and retuned with the assistance of an iPhone and commercial tuning app. Tuning beads on the pipes need to be placed with an accuracy of about 5mm on the longest 2.4m pipes dropping down to fractions of a millimetre on the shortest pipes. In practice, a carefully placed tap with a small block of wood makes all the difference. Hands are not allowed because they warm the pipes with the alteration in temperature causing chaos.

Following this work, I believe that we now have a full serviceable organ and I hope a happy organist. A fully voiced rendition of Blaenwern on Sunday was a promising sign.
